



<p>Pol. 317, 351</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A device, included under the definition of tobacco product above, if sold by a dispensary licensed in compliance with the Medical Marijuana Act. <i>Note: Federal law requires the district to maintain a drug-free workplace, at which marijuana of any kind is prohibited.</i></li> </ul>
<p>3. Authority 18 Pa. C.S.A. 6306.1 20 U.S.C. 7973 Pol. 818</p>	<p>The Board prohibits use of tobacco and vaping products, including the product marketed as Juul or other e-cigarettes, by district employees and contracted personnel at any time in a school building; on school buses or other vehicles that are owned, leased or controlled by the school district; or on property owned, leased or controlled by the school district.</p>
<p>18 Pa. C.S.A. 6306.1</p>	<p>The Board also prohibits use of tobacco and vaping products, including the product marketed as Juul and other e-cigarettes, by district employees at any time while responsible for the supervision of students during school-sponsored activities that are held off school property.</p>
<p>18 Pa. C.S.A. 6305</p>	<p>This policy does not prohibit possession of tobacco and vaping products, including the product marketed as Juul and other e-cigarette, by district employees and contracted personnel of legal age.</p>
<p>18 Pa. C.S.A. 6305</p>	<p>The Board deems it to be a violation of this policy for any district employee or contracted personnel to furnish a tobacco or vaping product, including the product marketed as Juul or any other e-cigarette, to a student.</p>
<p>4. Delegation of Responsibility 18 Pa. C.S.A. 6306.1</p>	<p>The Superintendent or designee shall notify employees and contracted personnel about the Board’s tobacco and vaping products policy by publishing information in handbooks, newsletters, posters, and other efficient methods such as posted notices, signs, and on the district website.</p>
<p>18 Pa. C.S.A. 6305, 6306.1</p>	<p>This policy does not prohibit the use of a patch, gum, or lozenge as a smoking cessation product by any employee who has a written order by a physician.</p>
<p>5. Reporting  24 P.S. 1303-A Pol. 805.1</p>	<p><u>Office for Safe Schools Report</u></p> <p>The Superintendent shall annually, by July 31, report incidents of prohibited possession, use or sale of tobacco and vaping products, including Juuls or other e-cigarettes, on school property to the Office for Safe Schools on the required form.</p>

C.S.A. 6305, 6306.1 22 PA Code 10.2, 10.22 24 P.S. 1302.1-A,</p>	<p><u>Law Enforcement Incident Report</u></p> <p>The Superintendent or designee may report incidents involving the sale of tobacco and vaping products, including Juuls or other e-cigarettes, to minors by employees on school property, at any school-sponsored activity, or on a conveyance providing transportation to or from a school or school-sponsored activity to the school police, School Resource Officer (SRO), or to the local police department that has</p>
